## COMMENT: Scheme Amendment No.2 to the Shire of Nannup Local Planning Scheme No.4

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on Scheme Amendment No.2 to the Shire of Nannup Local Planning Scheme No.4 to rezone portion of Lot 11 Cundinup-Dudinyillup, Nannup from 'Priority Agriculture' to 'Rural' and remove Additional Site Requirement No.4 (ASR4) that is associated with the 'Priority Agriculture' zoning.

The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) does not object to the rezoning of a portion of Lot 11 Cundinup-Dudinyillup, Nannup and the removal of ASR4 as this will allow for a single zoning (Rural) across the entire lot. The area currently zoned 'Priority Agriculture' has very steep slopes and a 'Rural' zoning therefore better reflects the capability of the land.
